Theme of the CSR project:

1. Bridge Training and Placement support for education dropout Candidates:

The Bridge program focuses on underprivileged educational dropout candidates, between the age group 18 to 25 years, those who are looking for employment, seeking skills or want to enhance their knowledge.

As a first stage of this program, two batches were invited, and the program was conducted simultaneously at two different locations, supported by Trinity training academy.

So far, over 150 individuals have benefited from this program. They find a better path to grow by gaining confidence, improving employability, and accessing new opportunities in the digital world.

2. Distribution of 200 Nos. Sewing machine and training.

The sewing machine program focuses on empowering family members—both men and women—who aim to support their families and build a respected place in society.

Also, a free training program is arranged, it includes learning machine setup, threading, basic stitches, fabric handling, and simple sewing projects. It also covers maintenance, troubleshooting, and proper use of tools and materials. Participants learn how to make this opportunity to improve their financial situation and potentially start a small business or tailoring a career.
