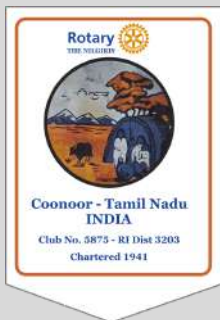

They recalled the many challenges faced over the decades, from identifying and nurturing younger Rotarians willing to take on leadership roles to mobilising resources for community projects in an era when CSR funding was virtually non-existent. Every project demanded personal effort, persistence, and the support of fellow Rotarians.

Among the Club's landmark achievements remembered with pride, was the long and determined effort to establish an LPG Crematorium for the

residents of the Nilgiris. Overcoming numerous administrative and logistical hurdles, the project finally became a reality in Coonoor in 2005 and stands today as a valuable community asset and a blessing for countless families. Other impactful initiatives recalled included the installation of Water Doctors in educational institutions to provide safe drinking water and the implementation of rainwater harvesting systems in one of the residential schools, to address critical water needs.

The Past Presidents also expressed their appreciation for the energy and commitment being brought in by newer members, whose dedication to service is helping carry forward Rotary's ideals. While celebrating the achievements of the outgoing year, they encouraged all members to remain actively engaged, mentor future leaders, and continue building on the strong foundation laid by generations of Rotarians. Their collective message was one of optimism and confidence that the Club's finest years of service still lie ahead.

For many of us who have joined Rotary in recent years, listening to these distinguished Past Presidents was both inspiring and enlightening. Their recollections offered a valuable glimpse into the challenges, sacrifices and determination that shaped many of the Club's landmark projects and achievements. SPEAKER SPOTLIGHT



Padma Bhushan Dr Ajai Chowdhry
Co-founder, HCL

Padma Bhushan Dr. Ajai Chowdhry, is one of the six founding members of HCL and widely regarded as one of the pioneers of India's Information Technology and Electronics Revolution.

Born in Mount Abu and educated at Jabalpur Engineering College, Dr. Chowdhry embarked on a remarkable entrepreneurial journey that helped shape India's technology landscape. As a co-founder of HCL in 1976, he played a pivotal role in building one of India's most respected technology enterprises and in establishing India as a global IT powerhouse.

His contributions extend far beyond business. For decades, he has been a passionate advocate for India's self-reliance in electronics, semiconductors and advanced technologies. He currently serves as Chairman of the Mission Governing Board of India's National Quantum Mission and is a member of the Advisory Board of the India Semiconductor Mission, helping shape the nation's technological future.

In recognition of his extraordinary contribution to the growth of India's IT and electronics industry, the Government of India conferred upon him the *Padma Bhushan*, one of the nation's highest civilian honours, in 2011.

What is particularly inspiring is that even after achieving immense success as an entrepreneur, Dr. Chowdhry continues to devote his time and energy to mentoring young innovators, supporting startups, strengthening educational institutions, and championing India's technological aspirations.

We had the honour and privilege to host Dr Ajai Chowdhry at our club on

A Glimpse Into India's Technological Future Padma Bhushan Dr Ajai Chowdhry



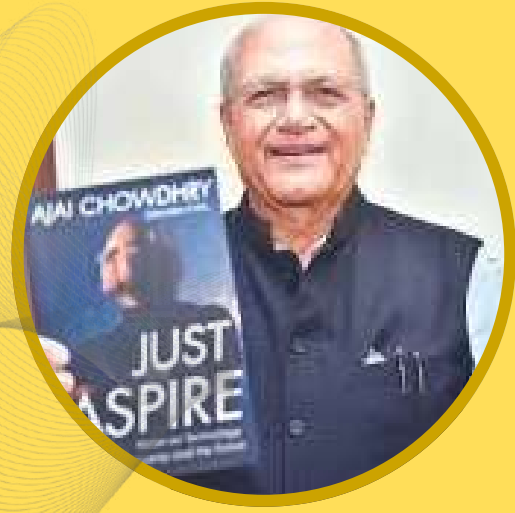
Rotarians and Anns were privileged to listen to an inspiring and thought-provoking address by Padma Bhushan Dr. Ajai Chowdhry, Co-founder of HCL and one of India's pioneering technology leaders, on 2nd June, 2026.

Dr. Chowdhry began by taking the audience back to the formative years of India's IT revolution. Recounting the founding of HCL in 1975, he described how six young friends pooled together a modest sum of ₹1.86 lakh to start a computer company at a time when India was governed by the restrictive licence-permit regime. With little capital, limited experience, and no concept of

“start-ups” as we know them today, the group faced numerous challenges, including the inability to secure a manufacturing licence. Their perseverance, however, ultimately laid the foundation for what would become one of India's most respected technology enterprises. His story served as a powerful reminder that vision, courage, and determination often matter more than resources.

Turning to the future, Dr. Chowdhry spoke extensively about emerging technologies that are poised to transform the world. As Chairman of the National Quantum Mission, he shared insights into India's ambitious ₹6,000-crore initiative aimed at making the country self-reliant in quantum technologies. He explained how quantum computing differs fundamentally from conventional computing and highlighted its immense potential in areas such as advanced prediction systems, scientific research, and drug discovery, building a robust ecosystem of scientists, laboratories, and start-ups dedicated to quantum research.

A Glimpse Into India's Technological Future Padma Bhushan Dr Ajai Chowdhry

Dr. Chowdhry also explored the rapidly evolving field of Artificial Intelligence and its long-term implications. Looking beyond the next decade, he discussed the possibility of “superintelligence,” a stage at which machines may surpass human cognitive capabilities. While acknowledging that such developments may sound futuristic, he highlighted how advances in computing, human-machine integration, and nanotechnology could dramatically reshape education, healthcare, and everyday life.

Particularly fascinating were his observations on nanobots—microscopic machines that could one day travel through the human bloodstream to repair damaged cells and combat diseases. Such innovations, he suggested, could significantly extend human life expectancy and transform modern medicine.

Throughout his address, Dr. Chowdhry combined technical expertise with an engaging vision of the future, encouraging the audience to think beyond current realities and appreciate the speed at which technology is advancing.



His presentation offered Rotarians a rare opportunity to gain firsthand insights into the innovations that are likely to define the coming decades, reaffirming the importance of preparing society for an era of unprecedented change.

This also served as an opportunity to recognise and appreciate the efforts of Entrepreneurs by the presentation of certificates that they earned from their training and written exam.



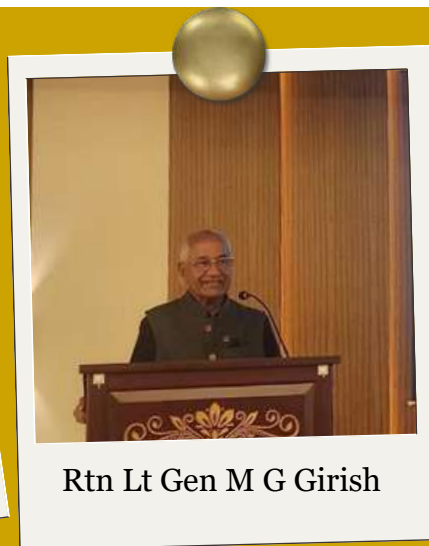
By encouraging an open discussion, sharing experiences and celebrating achievements, the event aimed to strengthen collaboration and inspire continued commitment towards the program's goals.

SCHOOL INFRASTRUCTURE HANDOVER & TEACHER DEVELOPMENT INITIATIVE

A team of Rotarians recently visited Panchayat Union Middle School, Bettati, for the formal handover of several infrastructure development projects undertaken by the Club to enhance the learning environment and overall school facilities.

Rtn. Sanjay Khanna presented a brief report on the completed projects, which included the comprehensive repainting of the school buildings. The previous green colour scheme has now been replaced with an elegant grey palette, giving the campus a more contemporary and public-school-like appearance. Other significant additions include a newly constructed Science Laboratory, a dedicated Spoken English Classroom, roofing of the open area adjoining the stage, to provide protection from sun and rain during school activities, and the implementation of a Rainwater Harvesting system to support environmental sustainability.

Rtn. Falguni Chakravarty then presented a brief report on the intensive teacher capacity-building programme conducted during the summer vacation for the newly appointed teachers. The training focused on Spoken English, Phonics, Communication Skills, Learner-centred Teaching Methodologies and classroom engagement strategies. She also highlighted the ongoing mentoring and hand-holding support that she will continue to provide throughout the academic year on a voluntary basis.

The gathering also witnessed the formal introduction of the newly appointed teachers, who will be handling Kindergarten, Spoken English, Mathematics and Physical Education. The teachers expressed their enthusiasm and commitment towards contributing to the growth of the school and its students.

Periodic Servicing of the LPG Crematorium in Progress

‘Sorga Bhoomi’, the LPG operated crematorium located on the Wellington Cantonment cremation ground, was established and is maintained and operated by the Rotary Club of the Nilgiris. It has been providing a dignified, hygienic and environmentally responsible cremation service to our community for several years.

Throughout this period, we have endeavoured to keep our charges affordable despite rising operational costs.

Over the past couple of months however, there has been an unprecedented increase in the cost of LPG, which is the primary fuel used in the crematorium.

The price of commercial LPG cylinders has risen by nearly 60%, and suppliers have indicated that further increases cannot be ruled out.

In addition, the costs associated with maintenance of the cremation equipment, upkeep of the facility and other operational expenses have also increased substantially over the years.

PROJECT UPDATE

Servicing the 100 feet chimney & other protective structures

Following a detailed review of operational expenses, maintenance requirements and service sustainability, it has become necessary to revise the charges.

Accordingly, with effect from 1st June 2026, the cremation charges at the Rotary Crematorium are being revised from ₹9,000 to ₹12,000 per cremation.

This decision has been made solely to ensure the continued provision of a reliable and dignified service to the community. We also assure the public that should LPG prices reduce significantly in the future, the charges will be reviewed accordingly.

We seek the understanding and support of the community in this matter and thank all citizens for their continued trust and cooperation.
