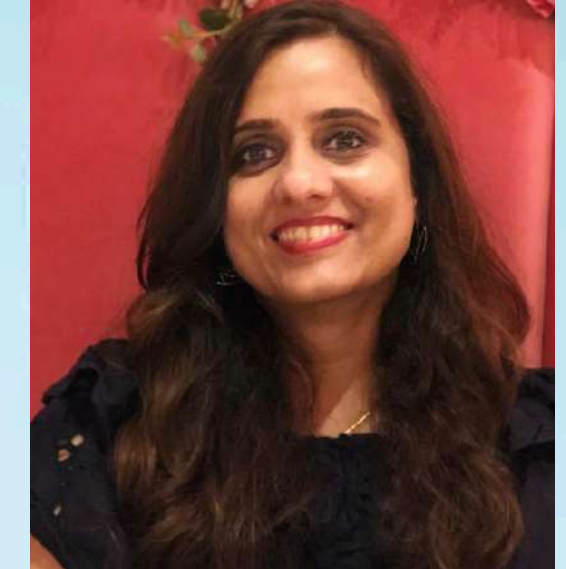

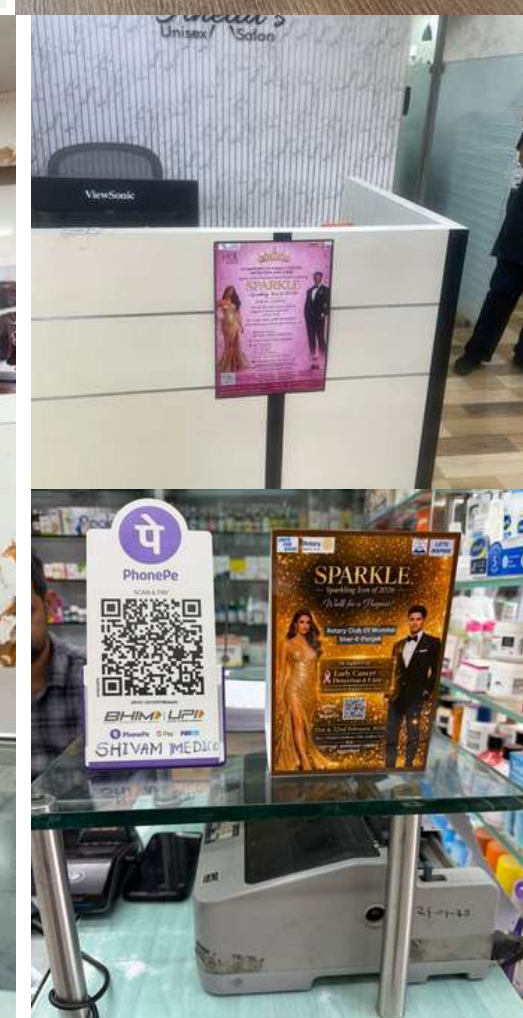

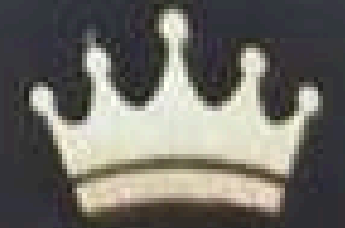

DONATIONS FOR RURAL COMMUNITIES

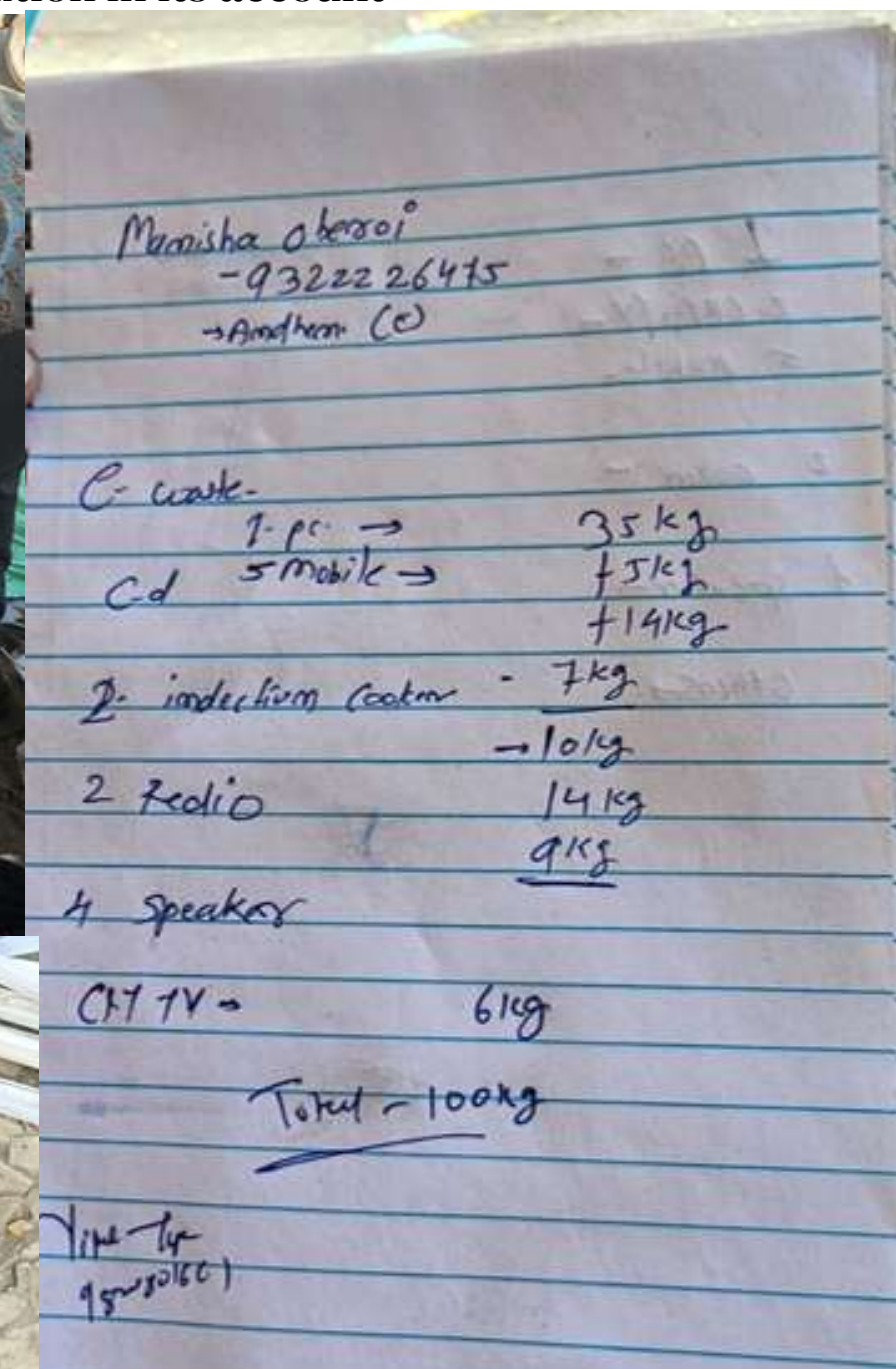

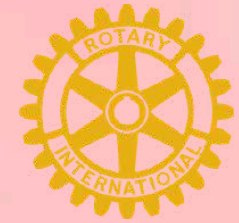
SUSTAINABILITY THROUGH E-WASTE COLLECTION DRIVE

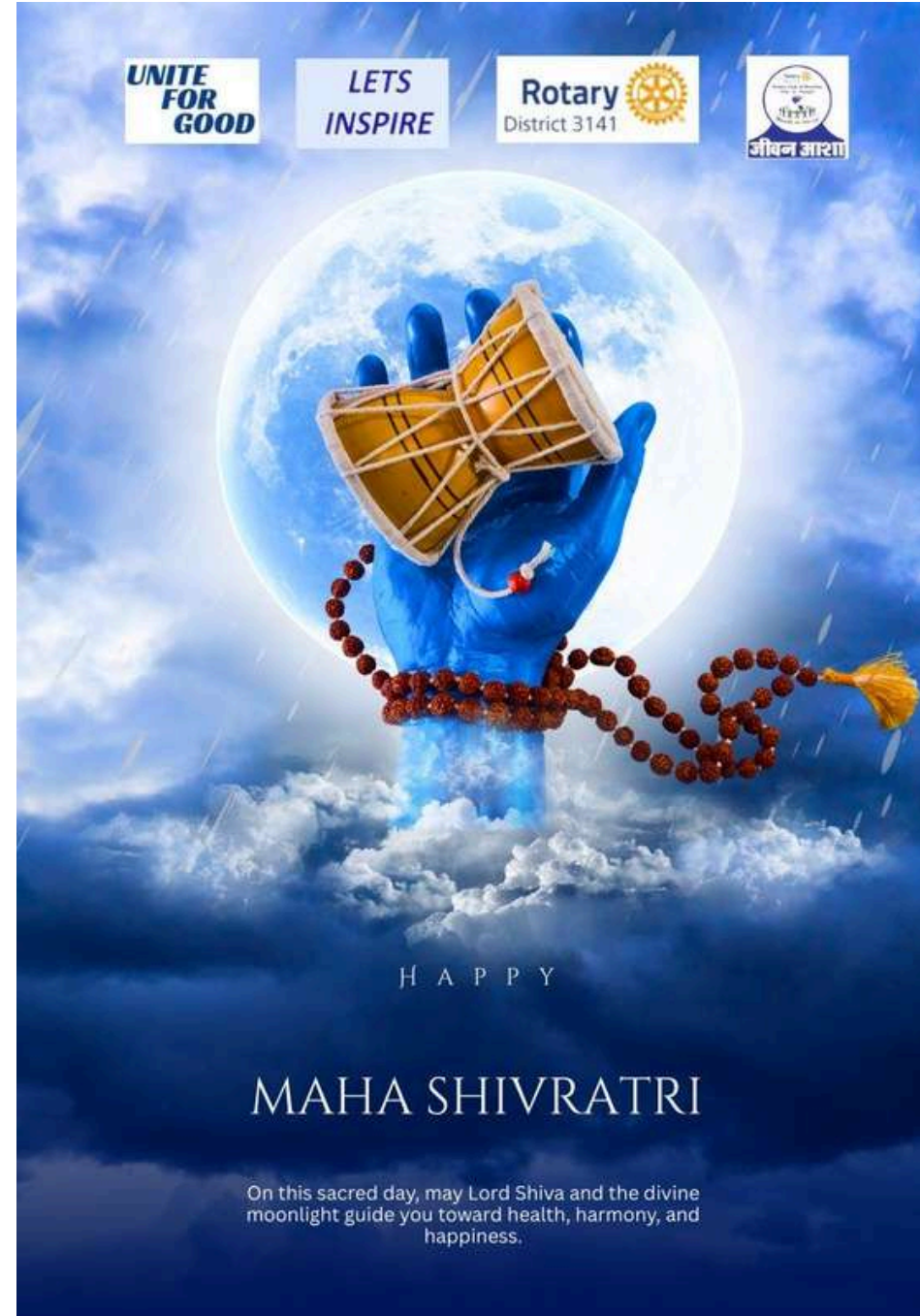
MUMBAI MERI JAAN FUN FACTS

- Mumbai was originally a group of 7 islands that were merged over time to form the city we know today.
